

MANUFACTURING FACILITY

The interiors of this facility were designed to reflect a state of the art manufacturing process. Exposed steel structure and decking blended with modern forms and a generous use of daylighting to produce an appropriate and dynamic interior. The spaces were designed to flow one into another; and the continuity of finishes and color reinforce that design character. The use of warm bright colors was used to offer a contrast from the white sterile cleanrooms that serve as the primary work environment. The richly grained Jarrah Wood is complemented by Maple paneling accents and doors. The juxtaposition of these two woods adds to the dynamic character and at the same time brings focus to the beauty of the two woods by the contrast created in placing one next to the other. Lighting was used as a tool to accentuate the spaces and provide focus to the space-forming elements of the building. The cleanrooms were designed to be a very bright, artificial light where the focus was task oriented. The office and break areas use a combination of natural, ambient and accent lighting at lower light levels for a welcome relief from the cleanrooms.
